New Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) regulations are emerging rapidly at the state level across the U.S (California, Colorado, Maine, Minnesota, Maryland, Oregon). These laws require producers to report and manage the lifecycle of their packaging materials – with some of the first reporting deadlines as early as March 31, 2025, in Colorado and Oregon.

Companies that are unprepared may face:

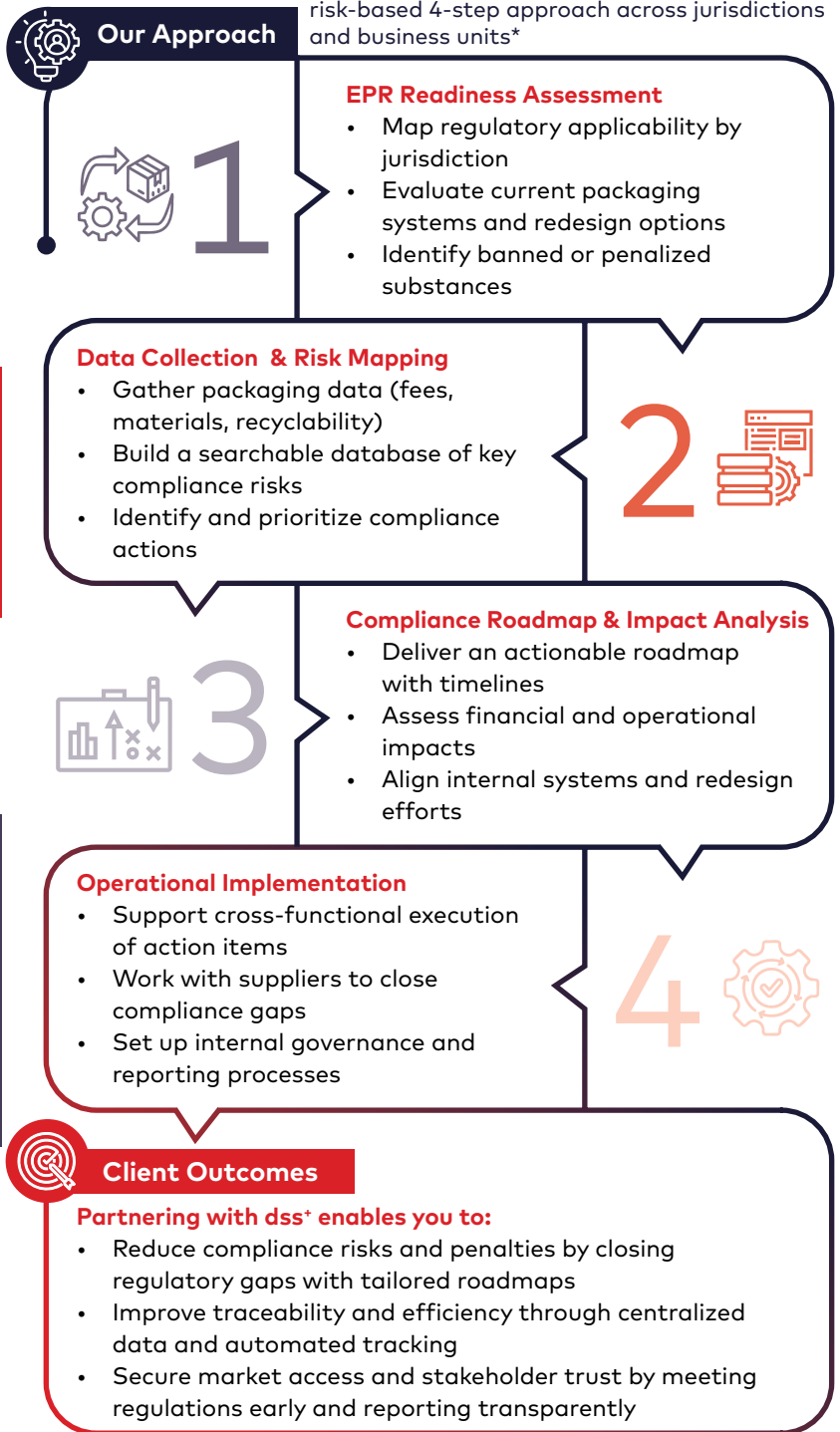
- Fines and penalties
